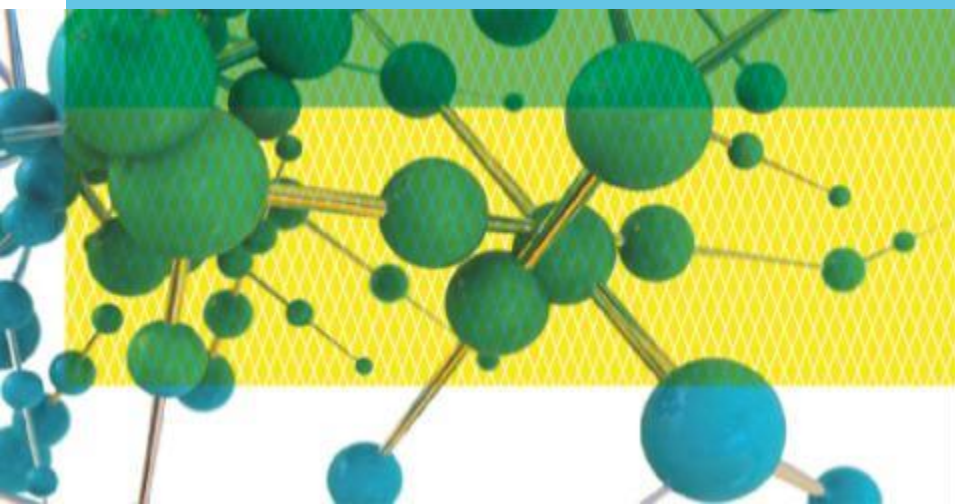

What is FIP?



- The International Pharmaceutical Federation (FIP)
- Is the global federation of national associations representing 3 million pharmacists and pharmaceutical scientists around the world
- It was founded in 1912 in the Netherlands
- In official relations with World Health Organization (WHO) since 1948, with official links with UNESCO and the United Nations General Assembly (through the ECOSOC committee)

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Vision, mission and strategic objectives of FIP for 2020



Vision: Wherever and whenever decision makers discuss any aspects of medicines on a global level, FIP is at the table.

Mission: FIP's Mission is to improve global health by advancing pharmacy practice and science to enable better discovery, development, access to and safe use of appropriate, cost-effective, quality medicines worldwide.

Three strategic objectives:

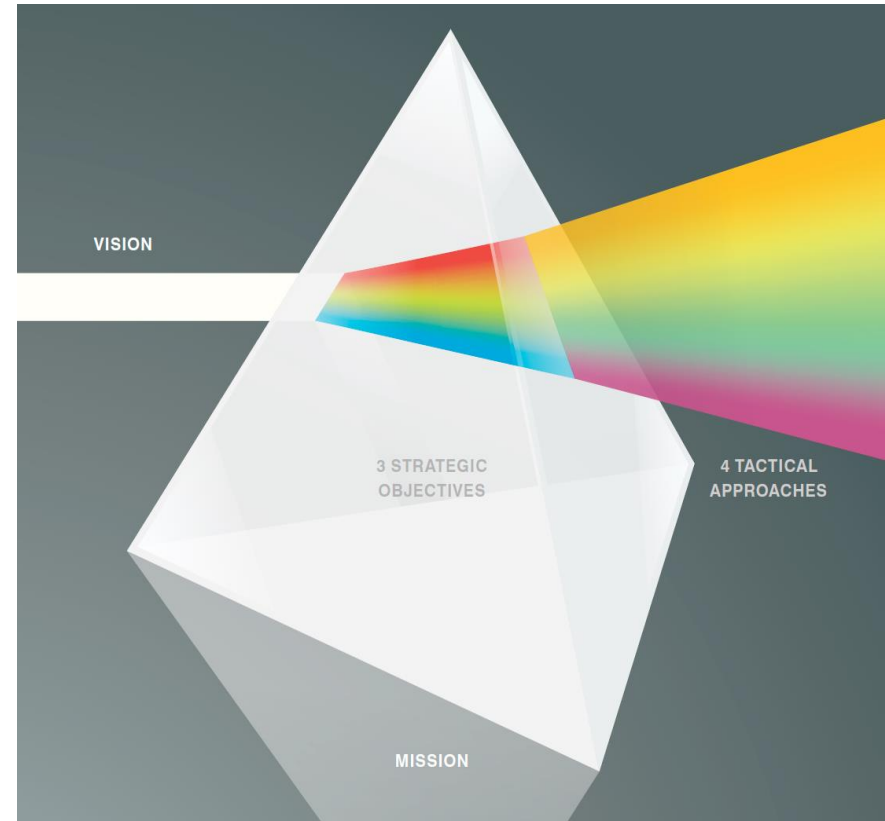
1. Advance pharmacy practice in all settings

3. Increase FIP's role in reforming pharmacy and pharmaceutical sciences education

3. Increase revenues of FIP to accomplish its global mission
4. Increase effective communications

Professionalism, Cost effectiveness, Creativity, Enthusiasm, Transparency, Flexibility



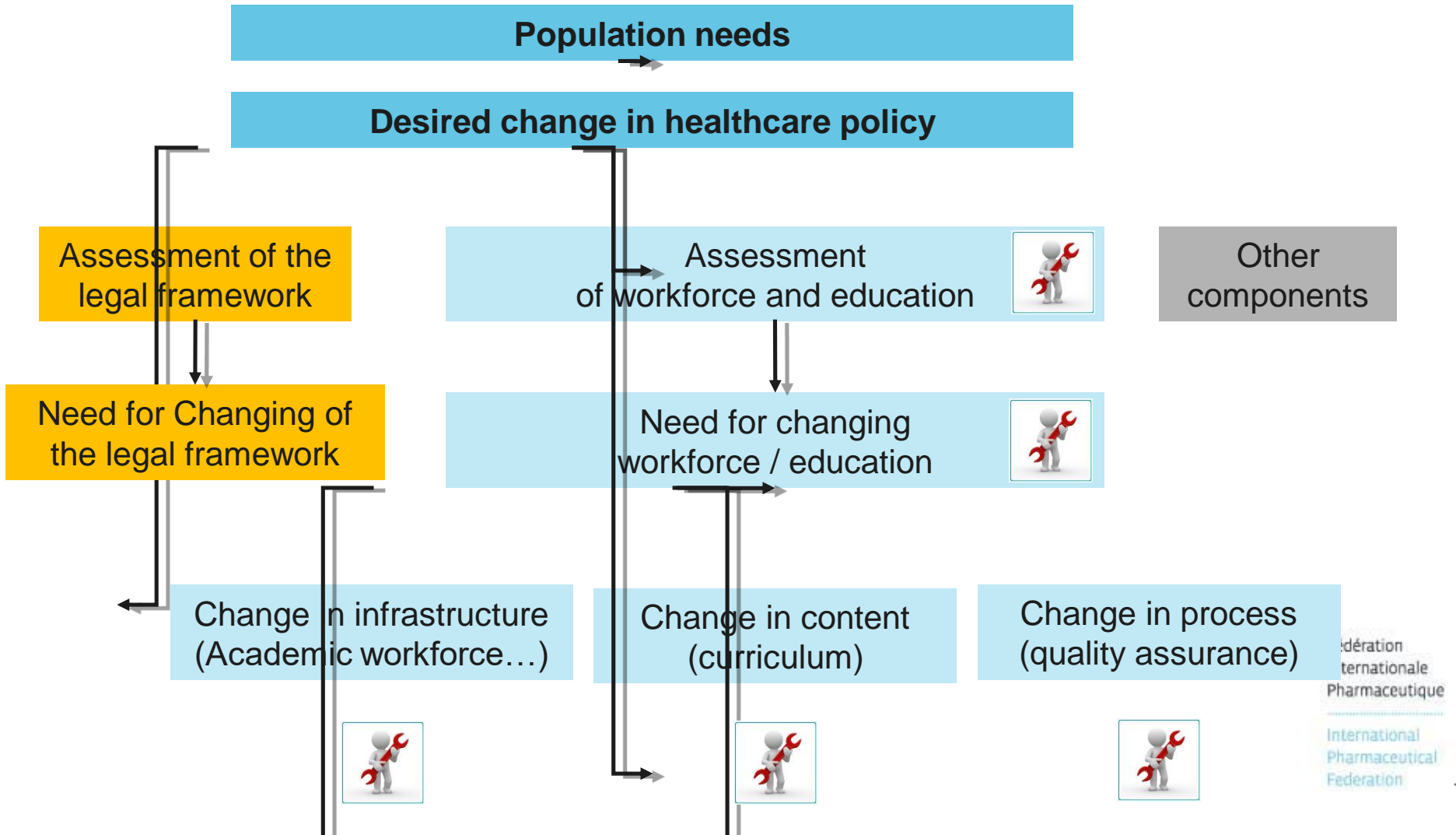
Priorities of FIP



- Promoting responsible use of medicines
 - New concept introduced during the Ministers Summit organised at the FIP Centennial in 2012
- Ensuring an enabling environment for the implementation of responsible use of medicines:
 - Education
 - Policy
 - Practice
 - Sciences

FIP*Ed* Framework to support change in pharmacy education

FIP*Ed* develops methodological tools, resources and guidance for each step



Projects within FIP: practice and policy



- Medicine Shortage Summit (June 2013) and report of the meeting
- Chief Pharmacists meeting in 2013 FIP Congress (August 2013)
 - To discuss the implementation of responsible use of medicines
 - Organised by the Irish Ministry of Health
- Statement on MNCH (August 2013)

Projects within FIP: practice and policy



- Report on Ethics, Autonomy and Professionalism (August 2013)
- POPAD: database on all the activities organized by our member organizations (programmes of care, quality, health promotion...)
- Reports on the contributions of pharmacists in specific fields (diabetes in 2012; asthma and mental health in 2014)
- Work on remuneration models for hospital and community pharmacy services (2013-2015)

Projects within FIP: practice and policy



- Counterfeit medicines
 - Specific activities of FIP in this field
 - Joint partnership with NABP on DOT pharmacy
 - Coordination of WHPA campaign on counterfeit medicines

Projects within FIP: sciences

- Pharmaceutical Sciences World Congress
- Contribution to scientific work of WHO
(pharmacopoeias, expert committee, joint paper on compounding and children...)
- Impact of pharmaceutical sciences over the last 50 years and promotion of the scientific career path to students
